AT A COUNTY COMMISSION HELD FOR PENDLETON COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA, AT THE COURTHOUSE, ON TUESDAY, APRIL 16, 2024 AT 9:00 A.M.

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: CARL HEVENER, ROGER DAHMER AND JIMMIE BENNETT

Commissioner Dahmer led those present in prayer. Commissioner Hevener called the meeting to order.

Minutes of the April 2, 2024 meeting of the County Commission, on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, were unanimously approved.

### Maintenance:

Refrigerator at the Pendleton County Community Building (PCCB) has been repaired. There was spray painting on the side of the handicap ramp. Karen Pitsenbarger, County Administrator is working towards a method of removing the spray paint.

Diana Mitchell, 911 Director, mentioned that April 14 - 20, 2024 is National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week.

Ms. Mitchell presented requests for two new road names out at the Golf Course. On motion of Commissioner Bennett, Northridge Trail and Fairway Lane were approved.

Commissioner Hevener inquired if all road sign installations were up to date. She stated that there is a batch ready now to be put up and that there are several that are faded and will need to be replaced. She is working on getting a list of those to order.

Rick Gillespie, Emergency Services Coordinator, updated the Commission on the Seneca Rocks Tower Site. Two of the environmental surveys are done and hopes the foundation may be started within two weeks. The tower is still being built and the company that will be installing it has been very busy.

He also mentioned that with the work being done to update and upgrade the Emergency Services Office and the Command Trailer, that his budget may need to be increased. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Commission agreed to do a budget revision for the Emergency Services department.

Mr. Gillespie also mentioned that the fire departments have been submitting bills for reimbursement from the Title III funds. However, some have been submitting per incident while others have submitted per apparatus per incident. After discussing, the Commission, on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, all emergency services agencies may submit per apparatus per incident effective as of March 16, 2024.

Ms. Pitsenbarger updated the Commission on the Courthouse Annex. We are currently waiting on the USDA to approve for it to be put out to bid. They are waiting on the financial feasibility report which is expected to be completed within the next three to four weeks.

David Cooper, Executive Director of Tucker Community Foundation, told the Commission about their foundation and that they would be interested in adding Pendleton County as a service area. They currently serve seven West Virginia counties and one Maryland county. He stated that today was just an inquiry to distribute information about the program. He stated that any money raised in this county would stay in this county. They generally give out scholarships in the Spring and grants in the Fall. It would take about a year to do all of the inquiries to other non-profit organizations in the county before adding Pendleton into the service area. Commissioner Hevener said they would look over the information.

The National Day of Prayer Proclamation was read by Commissioner Dahmer. The proclamation designates Thursday, May 2, 2024 as the National Day of Prayer. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Commission approved the proclamation. Margie Derby thanked the Commission for supporting this day. She and her husband are commissioners for the National Day of Prayer.

This being the date for the Commission to officially adopt the levy rates for property taxation for fiscal year 2025, a motion was made by Commissioner Dahmer, vote was unanimous, to approve the following levy rates to be laid on each One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars of assessed valuation of each class of property:

Class II Rates - 28.60 Class III Rates - 57.20 Class IV Rates - 57.20

## NET AMOUNT TO BE RAISED BY LEVY \$2,693,986

Mr. Gillespie reported on behalf of Mike Alt and Tina Eye, who had to leave early to respond to a call, that they will be submitting the first quarterly invoice for the EMS Salary Enhancement funds. Mr. Gillespie mentioned that the response times have improved due to the incentives from this fund.

Upon motion of Commissioner Bennett, vote unanimous, the Commission approved the 2024-2025 West Virginia Counties Risk Pool Insurance proposal for Liability and Workmen's Compensation in the amount of \$81,609. This is an increase of \$7,280 from the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

The Commission reviewed the Sheriff's Financial Statement for March 2024.

Sherry Mongold, Seneca Rocks Regional Development Authority, said they were working on the Franklin Hub site to get it ready for tenants.

Amber Nesselrodt, CVB Director, said they are still working with the Department of Highways to have the new Welcome to Pendleton County signs installed. She said they are also working with the Historical Society and the Civil War Trails to update and/or replace those signs.

The following exonerations, on motion of Commissioner Bennett, vote unanimous, were approved:

Eriks Brolis, Union District, \$153.18 Amber & Jason Dunn, Mill Run District, \$348.12 The Commission reviewed the March timesheets of all employees.
