AT A COUNTY COMMISSION HELD FOR PENDLETON COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA, AT THE COURTHOUSE, ON TUESDAY, APRIL 18, 2023 AT 9:00 A.M.

Commissioner Dahmer led those present in prayer. Commissioner Hevener opened the meeting.

Minutes of the April 4, 2023 meeting of the County Commission, on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, were unanimously approved.

Scott Somerville apologized to the Commission for any unpleasant comments he may have made to the Commissioners at the previous meeting. He encouraged all those present to be courteous to the Commissioners.

Barbara Dean, representative for Friends of Beautiful Pendleton County, gave a brief synopsis of when the group was organized and their purpose. She discussed their opinion of potential negative issues of wind turbines. She concluded by asking the Commission to pass a three-year moratorium on any structures in excess of 200 feet with the exemption of communication towers used for communication purposes only.

Several members of the public expressed their concerns about the wind turbines possibly being built in Pendleton County and the potential negative impacts they could have in regards to tourism, agritourism, scenic views, water, noise, traffic and health.

Mike Wellenborg expressed concern about the Public Service Commission (PSC) fast-tracking an application for building wind turbines. He stated the need for a moratorium to allow time to review all aspects of the impact of the turbines in the County.

April Mallow, Prosecuting Attorney, informed everyone that she will be soliciting an opinion from the State Attorney General on the proper and legal method for creating a moratorium. She also mentioned that as of Monday, April 17, 2023 no siting certificate applications had been filed with the PSC.

Commissioner Hevener stated that grain producers could also be affected by the 200-foot limit in addition to communications towers. Any moratorium would need to be carefully worded to show that it is not singling out a single entity.

Laura Brown, EDA Director, mentioned she had spoken with the Randolph County EDA Director and they had indicated that businesses and property values had not been affected by the wind turbines as they were located in wooded areas.

Amber Nesselrodt, CVB Director, stated that she had talked with Grant County and they had said that tourism had increased over the last ten years and that some tourists came just to see the wind turbines.

Commissioner Hevener stated that they would work with the Prosecuting Attorney on procedures to move forward.

Tom Butcher, First Energy Regional Consultant, introduced himself to the Commissioners and reminded them that he may be contacted at any time for any issues or concerns they may have.

Maintenance:

The generator at the Pendleton County Community Building (PCCB) is on the pad and they are waiting on cable to arrive to connect it to the building.

The old HVAC system at the Health Department will need to be replaced eventually. AQS submitted a quote in the amount of \$6,900 to replace the system. On motion of Commissioner Bennett, vote unanimous, the quote was approved.

Karen Pitsenbarger, County Administrator, mentioned that the HVAC system at PCCB is also old and beginning to require extra maintenance.

Diana Mitchell, 911 Director, presented to the Commission a request for a road name. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Commission approved the name Riverview Cabin Dr, which will be off of Route 220 in Ruddle.

Rick Gillespie, Emergency Services Coordinator, informed the Commission that the 911 dispatchers had done a good job over the last week as there have been numerous calls, including four helicopter transports.

In recognition during National Public Safety Telecommunications week, Commissioner Dahmer read a letter from the Commission to all of the 911 personnel honoring their efforts and recognizing their contributions year-round with a heartfelt thank you. The letter will be sent to each 911 staff member.

Mr. Gillespie stated that he has been working on several grant applications for emergency services and the sheriff's department. The National Radio Quiet Zone has put out an advertisement for a study of the quiet zone. There are at least two companies that are preparing to submit a proposal. He is also waiting for a proposal from Motorola to replace the County's communication system to submit for a Department of Defense grant.

Laura Brown, EDA Director, informed the Commission that the Gig-ready grant that have been working on for the past year will be submitted next week.

Amber Nesselrodt, CVB Director, is working on information for the new bill passed by the legislature that limits liability issues to private landowners who have tourist locations on their property and allow tourists to come on their property.

Mrs. Pitsenbarger said that still have not received any estimates for removal of the heating fuel tank. Omni Associates made recommendations to the bid from Lantz Construction for the ADA ramp at the Courthouse. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the changes were approved.

This being the date for the Commission to officially adopt the levy rates for property taxation for fiscal year 2024, a motion was made by Commissioner Bennett, vote was unanimous, to approve the following levy rates to be laid on each One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars of assessed valuation of each class of property:

On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, a resolution was signed authorizing the submission of a grant under the West Virginia Court Security Fund Program in the amount of \$122,882. The funds would go towards purchase of a camera system, metal detector and x-ray scanner at the Courthouse.

Elise White, County Clerk, informed the Commission that there are additional grant funds available under the Help America Vote Act (HAVA). She requested to apply for funds to purchase electronic pollbook systems for each precinct. If approved, the grant would pay for 85% of the \$26,799.00 purchase price. On motion of Commissioner Bennett, vote unanimous, a resolution and application were signed to request the grant funds.

On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Shentel Cable Franchise Agreement was approved for a five-year period.

Peter Tuckerman has resigned from the Pendleton County Library Board. A request has been submitted to appoint Brenna Mitchell to fill his term. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, she was appointed for the remainder of his term which will end July 1, 2027.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion, vote unanimous, to proclaim the week of April 23 - 29, 2023 as National Library Week.

The Commission reviewed the Sheriff's financial statement for the month of March 2023.
