COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: CARL HEVENER, ROGER DAHMER AND JIMMIE BENNETT

OTHERS PRESENT: ELISE WHITE, COUNTY CLERK; KAREN PITSENBARGER, COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR; RICK GILLESPIE, EMERGENCY SERVICES COORDINATOR; DIANA MITCHELL, 911 DIRECTOR; STEPHEN SMOOT, THE PENDLETON TIMES; LAURA BROWN, FISHER MOUNTAIN; SHERRY MONGOLD, SENECA ROCKS REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (SRRDA); MIKE ALT, TINA EYE

Commissioner Dahmer led those present in prayer. Commissioner Hevener called the meeting to order.

Minutes of the June 18, 2024 meeting of the County Commission, on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, were unanimously approved.

Commissioner Hevener discussed the parking of heavy trucks on the parking lot at the Pendleton County Community Building (PCCB). As the lot was recently paved, he recommended that signs be ordered stating no commercial trucks are allowed to park on the lot.

He also mentioned that the tent holes left in the parking lot by the Springfest tent had not been filled in after the event back in May. Commissioner Hevener filled them in yesterday.

Rick Gillespie, Emergency Services Coordinator, mentioned that there is a crack in the asphalt down the middle of the helipad area that has grass growing out of it. Commissioner Hevener stated he would check it out and see if it can be filled in also. Mr. Gillespie also mentioned that there were two trees growing near the wash bay and OEM storage shed that need to be removed.

Karen Pitsenbarger, County Administrator, informed the Commission that the storage building for the back parking lot has been ordered.

Laura Brown, Director of Development & Sales at Fisher Mountain, updated the Commission on improvements that have been made at Fisher Mountain. They currently have an agreement with the Pendleton County Public Service District for a water line extension, but are limited to the number of water taps. They would like for the County to obtain an independent water study from the Navy Base in Sugar Grove to Franklin. Mr. Gillespie shared concerns from an OEM and citizen perspective. He stated that the well at the 911 Center is still having issues. Ms. Brown said that with the study, there would be greater opportunities for grants for additional water lines. She recommended that the panel to select applicants to do the water study include someone from the Development Authority, County Commission, OEM, PSD and the Town.

On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the County will move forward to commission a water study for the area.

Commissioner Bennett made a motion, vote unanimous, to approve the resolution from the Farmland Protection Board reaffirming commitment to the voluntary Farmland Protection Act of 2020.

On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Commission went into Executive Session to discuss a personnel issue at 9:30 a.m. The Commission adjourned out of Executive Session on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous at 10:10 a.m. No decisions were taken in Executive Session.

Mr. Gillespie gave an update on the Seneca Rocks Tower site. They are currently waiting for the gravel to be applied to the road and for the tower contractor to drill the foundation caissons and build the foundation.

The USDA is requesting additional information from the County before making a decision on the application for a loan for the annex. Mrs. Pitsenbarger is gathering that information.

On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, Carl Hevener was reappointed to a four-year term to the WV Solid Waste Management Board.

The Commission reviewed the estimated carryover balance for General County for fiscal year 2025 as presented by Elise White, County Clerk.

A motion was made by Commissioner Bennett, vote was unanimous, to approve a Coal Severance Fund budget revision for fiscal year 2025 to appropriate the assigned fund balance ending June 30, 2024 in the amount of \$6,515 showing an increase of \$515 over the original budgeted amount.
