April Mallow, Prosecuting Attorney, stated that she was still waiting on an opinion from the West Virginia Attorney General's Office regarding a moratorium.

Darren Taylor, Director of South Branch Valley Regional Day Report Center, gave an update on what they have been doing and the various services that they offer. They have recently signed a lease with the Pendleton County Economic and Development Authority (PCEDA) for space at the old Hanover Building to have an office in this County.

Rick Gillespie, Emergency Services Coordinator, stated that there was nothing to report for 911. He is working on a Department of Defense grant online. Also, the generator at Pendleton County Community Building (PCCB) is ready for diesel delivery and then will be operational.

There were no updates on broadband, per Laura Brown, EDA Director.

Karen Pitsenbarger, County Administrator, mentioned that she has still not received any estimates for removal of the heating oil tank. The Supreme Court is reviewing the Annex plans. Omni Associates will be at the next couple of meetings to keep us updated.
