AT A COUNTY COMMISSION HELD FOR PENDLETON COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA, AT THE COURTHOUSE, ON TUESDAY, MAY 21, 2024 AT 9:25 A.M.

Commissioner Dahmer led those present in prayer. Commissioner Hevener called the meeting to order.

Minutes of the May 7, 2024 meeting of the County Commission, on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, were unanimously approved.

Commissioner Dahmer read two proclamations for Mountain Heart proclaiming May as Community Action Month and May 10 as Child Care Provider Appreciation Day. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Commission approved the proclamations.

Brooke Alt, Pendleton County Extension Agent, introduced Jessica Hoover as the new Pendleton County Agriculture Extension Agent.

Amber Hedrick, Pendleton County Health Department, presented to the Commission the new fees for permits that had been approved by the Pendleton County Board of Health. The additional income generated by the increased fees would help cover the decreased funding received from the State. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Commission approved the increased fees. The new fees will go into effect on July 1, 2024.

Amber Nesselrodt, CVB Director, stated that the hotel/motel tax they received year-to-date was 12% more than the same period last year.

She informed the Commission that Laura Brown, one of the Seneca Rocks Mon Forest representatives, has stepped down. On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, Melinda Brooks was appointed to replace her.

Diana Mitchell, 911 Director, requested the Commission go into executive session to discuss a personnel issue.

Commissioner Dahmer made a motion, vote unanimous to go into Executive Session at 9:53 a.m. for a personnel issue. The Commission adjourned out of Executive Session at 10:00 a.m. No decisions were taken in Executive Session.

On motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous, the Commission directed Diana, as 911 Director, to send a letter to the employee for termination as discussed in executive session.

Rick Gillespie, Emergency Services Coordinator, indicated that a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the National Radio Quiet Zone (NRQZ) has been drafted offering to allow a higher power on the VHF band for Pendleton County. He stated that we are not currently licensed for VHF, but will need this MOU approved in order to obtain the licenses. On motion of Commissioner Bennett, vote unanimous, Commission President Carl Hevener was approved to sign the MOU when completed.

Mr. Gillespie gave an update on the status of the Seneca Rocks Tower Site. The road has been built and will be graveled soon. The geotechnical boring is complete.

The financial feasibility report required to move forward with the Annex has still not been received. The single point entry will begin on June 3, 2024 on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous.

Sherry Mongold, SRRDA, said they will be having a kick-off meeting with the DARE program personnel soon to discuss the renovation of the innovation hub in Franklin. Kelsen Thorne will be painting a mural on one of the walls of the hub.

The Commission signed the records grant agreement with the WV Division of Culture & History in the amount of \$10,000 with a 10% county match for personnel costs for back-indexing in the County Clerk's Office, on motion of Commissioner Dahmer, vote unanimous.

Commissioner Bennett motioned, vote unanimous, to sign a support letter for Community Action to obtain a grant to keep the center in Franklin.

The Commission also signed a Proclamation to continue supporting the Adult Treatment Program through the Drug Court Center.

Commissioner Hevener mentioned that the Circleville Volunteer Fire Department had sent a thank you note for the Commission's financial support.

The April 2024 financial statement from the Sheriff's Office and the employee April timesheets were reviewed.
